"Clean Heart, Clean Hands"

"Create in me a clean heart, oh God; and renew a right spirit within me." (Psalm 1:10)

One of the greatest conflicts between our relationship with God is when we give up on his promises! We pray! He has promised to answer! But, the answer is not forthcoming --- and the most frustrating thing is for us to wait! If we are a seasoned Christian, we know that God is not trifling with us; --- so what is going on?

The Lord answers prayer, always, in our best interest! Faith tells us He has delayed for our benefit. Never think that God is tempting you. "For God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempts He any man ---" (James 1:13). Christ will never be cruel simply to see us suffer, but He will "test" us! Why? Perhaps to strengthen us for what is ahead!

May Recipes & Kitchen Tips

Fall Simmer Pot Recipes

Place ingredients into water and simmer on stove in small pot for amazing smells

- **Cinnamon Apples:** 1/2 apple sliced, 2 whole cloves, 2 cinnamon sticks
- **Pumpkin Patch:** 1/2 tsp pumpkin pie spice, 2 whole anise, 1/2 apple sliced
- **Spicy Harvest:** 1/2 tsp nutmeg, 2 cinnamon sticks, 2 whole anise, 1 apple, sliced
- **Autumn Apple Pie:** 1 apple, sliced, 2 cinnamon sticks, 2 whole cloves, 1/2 tsp vanilla
- **Spicy Citrus:** Peel from 1 orange, Peel from 1/2 lemon, 1/2 tsp vanilla, 2 whole cloves
- **Pumpkin Spice:** 1 tsp pumpkin pie spice, 1/2 tsp nutmeg, 1 tsp vanilla
- **Cinnamon Citrus:** Peel from 1 orange, 3 cinnamon sticks, 1/2 tsp vanilla
- **Apple Cider:** 1 apple, sliced, 1/2 tsp lemon juice, 3 whole cloves, 2 cinnamon sticks
- **Cozy Autumn Evening:** 1/2 cup cranberries, Peel from 1 orange, 4 whole cloves, 1 tsp vanilla

Quick & Easy Meatloaf Recipe

Ingredients:

- 1 1/2 pounds ground beef
- 1 egg
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup oatmeal
- salt and pepper to taste
- For the sauce:
- 2 Tablespoons brown sugar
- 2 Tablespoons mustard
- 1/3 cup ketchup



Directions:

- Mix all meatloaf ingredients together in a large mixing bowl. Use a large spoon for mixing, and if you aren't too squeamish, wash your hands well and mix it together well with your hands.
- Press meatloaf mixture firmly into a loaf pan.
- Turn formed meatloaf onto a parchment paper lined baking pan with sides. Rather than baking meatloaf in a loaf pan (where the grease sits in a pool on the top ~ Yuck!), try this trick: Flip the packed meatloaf from the loaf pan onto a large pan with sides which has been lined with parchment paper. ("Whack it!" firmly on the bottom, till it slides out of the loaf pan.)
- With this method, the grease will then run out onto the pan as it bakes. It works like a charm!
- Mix the barbecue sauce ingredients together in another bowl and pour over the top of the meatloaf.
- Bake at 350 degrees for 1 to 1 1/2 hours, or until completely done (and not pink) in the center.

Buttery Garlic Mushrooms

Ingredients:

- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1/2 an onion chopped (optional)
- 1 pound Cremini or button mushrooms
- 1 teaspoon fresh thyme leaves chopped
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- 4 cloves garlic minced
- Salt and pepper to taste



Directions:

- Heat the butter and oil in a skillet over medium-high heat.
- Sauté the onion until softened (about 3 minutes).
- Add the mushrooms and cook for about 4-5 minutes until golden and crispy on the edges.
- Stir through thyme, 1 tablespoon of parsley and garlic. Cook for a further 30 seconds, until fragrant.
- Season generously with salt and pepper (to your taste).
- Sprinkle with remaining parsley and serve warm.

Peanut Butter Fudge

Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 (16 ounce) package brown sugar
- 1/2 cup milk
- 3/4 cup peanut butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 1/2 cups confectioners' sugar



Directions:

- Melt butter in a medium saucepan over medium heat; stir in brown sugar and milk. Bring to a boil and boil for 2 minutes, stirring frequently.
- Remove the pot from heat; stir in peanut butter and vanilla.
- Place confectioners' sugar in a large mixing bowl. Pour in peanut butter mixture and beat with an electric mixer until smooth.
- Pour peanut butter mixture into an 8x8-inch dish.
- Chill until firm before slicing, about 1 hour.

Buttermilk Pie

Ingredients:

- 3 large eggs
- 1 1/2 cups white sugar
- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/8 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
- 1 (9 inch) unbaked pie crust



Directions:

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- Beat eggs in a large bowl with an electric mixer until frothy. Add sugar, butter, and flour; beat until smooth.
- Stir in buttermilk, lemon juice, vanilla, and nutmeg. Pour into pie shell.
- Bake in the preheated oven until center is firm, 40 to 60 minutes. Remove from the oven and cool for 1 hour before serving.

Pumpkin Cheesecake Pie

Ingredients:

- 1 unbaked pie crust
- 1 8 Oz package cream cheese soften
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 4 eggs, divided
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 cup pecans copped
- 1 cup corn syrup
- 1/4 cup brown sugar packed



Directions:

- Beat cream cheese, sugar 1 egg and vanilla till smooth. Spread evenly in pie shell, sprinkle pecans over top cheese layer.
- Beat remaining 3 eggs, corn syrup and brown sugar together well. Pour evenly over pecans.
- Bake at 425 for 10 min, then reduce heat to 375 and bake for 25-30 min or until set and golden. Cool, slice and Enjoy!

Cream Cheese Sausage Balls

Ingredients:

- 1 lb hot sausage, uncooked (or any sausage you prefer)
- 8 oz cream cheese, softened
- 1 1/4 cups Bisquick
- 4 oz cheddar cheese, shredded
- Preheat oven to 400F



Directions:

- Mix all ingredients until well combined. Roll into 1-inch balls. Bake for 20-25 minutes, or until brown.
- Sausage balls may be frozen uncooked. If baking frozen, add a few minutes to the baking time.

Santa Claus origin: Where did St. Nick come from?

The jolly old elf with the magical sleigh came from the story of a humble monk named St. Nicholas, who was born in Turkey around 280 AD. Monk St. Nicholas acquired his sainthood after giving away all his wealth to help the poor and the needy. He became known as the patron saint of children and had his own honorary day on Dec. 6.

Early Dutch immigrants to the United States, however, get credit for the name Santa Claus. They brought with them their cultural tradition of celebrating the saint's death. They called him "Sint Nikolaas" (Dutch for Saint Nicholas) and abbreviated it to "Sinter Klaas," which has since evolved into Santa Claus.

The main characteristics of the Santa story—his jolly personality, gifts, a naughty-or-nice list, reindeer and chimney shenanigans—were put into place by the 1822 poem written by Episcopal minister Clement Clarke Moore. The poem is called "An Account of a Visit from St. Nicholas," but you likely know it by its iconic first line: "'Twas the night before Christmas ..."

You can thank Coca-Cola for the last component, the grandfatherly style of Santa Claus. Coke's early-1900s advertising featured a warm, happy elderly man with rosy cheeks, a white beard and twinkling eyes. It was so popular that it became the default image of Santa, who's now the central character in many Christmas books and Christmas movies for kids.


October 2023 Is Cybersecurity Awareness Month

- **Recognize & Report Phishing**—Be cautious of unsolicited messages asking for personal information. Never provide your login name and password requested by scam emails.
- **Update Software**—Ensuring your software is up to date is the best way to make sure you have the latest security patches and updates on your devices.
