Be The Good Samaritan

Who Was the Good Samaritan?

Jesus tells the parable, or story, of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10 of the New Testament. In that Bible chapter, he says, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him."

The Good Samaritan was the person who had mercy upon the man that was half-dead and robbed on the side of the road. After a priest and Levite passed the downtrodden man, showing him no mercy or compassion, the Samaritan took care of him and saved his life.

Meaning of the Good Samaritan Parable

The meaning of the Good Samaritan parable from Jesus is very simple: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Before telling the story of the Samaritan, Jesus is asked what is the greatest commandment of all. He answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'"

The parable of the Good Samaritan is a story to illustrate how we "love our neighbors as ourselves." When other people need our help the most, like the man on the road, is when our love for neighbor is truly tested. Jesus tells us to be like the Good Samaritan, helping others in times of need, and not the Priest and Levite who ignored their neighbor.

February Recipes

Strawberry Cake From Rosalyn Carter

Ingredients:

- 1 pkg yellow or white cake mix
- 1 3 oz package of strawberry Jello 3/4 cup cooking oil
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- 4 eggs
- 2 tbs flour
- 1 10 oz package of frozen strawberries or 1 pint of fresh strawberries with 1/2 cup of sugar

Directions:

- Mix all ingredients and beat well
- Pour into an angel food cake pan and bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until done
- Serve plain or with whipped cream.

Mrs. Wheat's Natchitoches Meat Pies

Ingredients Filling:

- 1-1/2 pounds ground beef
- 1-1/2 pounds ground pork
- 1 cup chopped green onions, white and green parts
- 2 or 3 cloves chopped garlic
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cavenne
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour

Ingredients Crust:

- 2 cups self-rising flour, plus about 2/3 cup more for rolling out dough
- 1/3 heaping cup Crisco shortening, not melted
- 1 egg, beaten
- 3/4 cup milk
- Vegetable oil, for deep-frying

Directions Filling:

- Combine meats, green onions, garlic, salt and peppers in large Dutch oven. Cook over medium heat, stirring often until meat is no longer red and is broken into small bits, about 15 minutes; do not overcook.
- Sift flour over meat, mixing thoroughly. Remove from heat. Place meat in a large colander to drain off liquid and cool to room temperature.

Directions Crust:

- Sift flour and cut shortening into it. Add egg and milk and mix. Form dough into ball (it will be very sticky). Roll out about 1/3 of dough at a time on heavily floured board with floured rolling pin to about 1/8-inch thick, adding least amount of flour possible to keep it from
- Cut dough into 5- to 5 1/2-inch circles. (Use a round sharp-edged dish or utensil of the correct size; or use a dumpling-maker form.) Cut out all dough circles before filling any, placing circles on cookie sheet. If necessary to stack pastry while making circles, place waxed paper between them.

Assemble Pies

- To assemble each pie, place a heaping tablespoon of filling on one side of pastry round. Dampen edge of pastry with fingertips moistened with water. Fold pastry over meat and crimp with fork tines dipped in water, pressing to seal.
- Prick each pie twice on top with fork. Freeze if desired, enclosed in self-sealing plastic bags; do not thaw before frving.
- Just before serving, carefully drop pies in oil heated to 350 degrees. Fry until dark golden brown, about 2 minutes. Drain on absorbent paper.

Oven Cooked Bacon

Ingredients:

Your favorite bacon (uncooked)

Directions:

- Place bacon on a raised grid backing sheet
- Place baking sheet into cold oven
- Set oven temperature to 425 degrees
- Set timer for 25 minutes
- Remove bacon and enjoy

Awesome Grilled Cheese Sandwich

Ingredients:

- 1 cup grated parmesan cheese
- Your favorite bread slices
- Your favorite sliced American, cheddar, Swiss, or other cheese

Directions:

- Butter one side of each slice of bread
- Spread grated parmesan cheese on plate
- and dip buttered side of bread in cheese until well coated
- Heat skillet on medium low heat and place each slide of bread, cheese side down, place 1 slice of cheese on each piece of bread and let cook for 3 and 1/2 minutes (Do not touch during this part)
- Place pan with bread slices into the oven and broil until sliced cheese on top is melted.
- Close up the cheese sandwich and enjoy.

Easy Egg Drop Soup

Ingredients:

- 4 eggs
- 8 cups of chicken stock
- 1 tbs corn starch
- Salt, pepper and sesame oil
- Diced green onions

Dii ections:

- Mix 4 eggs with 2 tbs of water until well mixed
- Bring 8 cups of chicken stock to boil in saucepan
- Mix 1 tbs corn starch with 1/2 cup of water into a slurry
- Lower temperature of water to a simmering boil
- Pour mixed eggs in as a steady small stream into the
- simmering water to form ribbons Add salt, pepper, diced green onions and sesame oil to taste
 - and enjoy!

Creamed Chipped Beef on Toast

- Ingredients: 1/4 cup butter
 - 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 2 cups whole milk
- 1 (4.5 ounces) jar dried beef, chopped
- 8 slices toast

Directions:

- In a saucepan, melt butter over medium
- heat. Stir in flour, salt, and pepper until well blended.
- Gradually whisk in milk so that no lumps form, and continue cooking and stirring until the mixture thickens.
- Stir in the chopped dried beef and cook until the beef is heated through.
- Serve the creamy chipped beef over crispy, golden-brown toast slices.

Valentine's Day History

From 13 to 15 February, ancient Romans celebrated the feast of Lupercalia. Many believe that the origins of Valentine's Day can be traced back to this ancient fertility festival. To mark the occasion Roman men sacrificed goats before using their skins to whip women in the belief that this would make them fertile. Some historians have argued that at the end of the 5th century, Pope Gelasius I declared 14 February to be Valentine's Day in an attempt to reclaim this festival from the Romans and Christianize it.



It's not clear which Saint Valentine this day was initially dedicated to, as two saints with this name share the feast day of 14 February. Both of these saints were martyred in Rome; Valentine of Terni in around AD 197 and Valentine of Rome in around AD 496.

Many legends have been recorded about the latter St Valentine, but these are most likely apocryphal. These include the story that Valentine himself fell in love with his jailor's daughter while incarcerated for giving aid to prisoners. According to this tale, St Valentine wrote his inamorata a note signed "from your Valentine": the first Valentine's greeting. However, while this fanciful story is compelling, it is unlikely to be true.

The next milestone in the history of Valentine's Day came in 1382, when Geoffrey Chaucer wrote his poem Parliament of Foules. This poem contains what is widely reported to be the first recorded instance of St Valentine's Day being linked to romantic love. This reference can be found in the lines:

In 15th-century France, 14 February became an annual feast day celebrating romantic love. Lavish banquets with singing and dancing were held to mark the occasion. It was also a 15th-century Frenchman who committed the earliest surviving Valentine's greeting to paper. While imprisoned in the Tower of London following the 1415 battle of Agincourt, the Duke of Orleans wrote to his wife:

In the mid-19th century the Valentine's card travelled across the Atlantic. Cards rapidly gained popularity in America, where they were initially advertised as a British fashion. Advanced American technologies meant that more elaborate cards were produced cheaply, encouraging their popularity yet further. In 1913 Hallmark Cards produced their first Valentine's card, representing a key development in the commercialization of Valentine's Day. Thanks in large part to marketing campaigns, Valentine's Day has today become a time not only for sending cards, but for buying flowers, jewelry, perfume and chocolates. And now you know this annual celebration of love is anything but modern.
