O truly blessed night, in whom earth is wedded to heaven, and humans to God!

Several rows of the people might have their candles lit. Over there, a lot more. Soon half the church could awaken to the gentle light. And, quickly, the rest. Morning has eased their faces into daylight, into the soft, humble glow.

Jesus became the night. Jesus is the light.


We can see him for who he has been all along. The Christ of God. The essence of love. The modest flame who softly lights the world.


