#### George MacDonald writes:

Because we are come out of the divine nature, which chooses to be divine, we much choose to be divine, to be of God, to be one with God, loving and living as he loves and lives, and so be partakes of the divine nature, or we perish. Man cannot originate this life; it must be shown him, and he must choose it. God is the father of Jesus and of us —of every possibility of our being; but while God is the father of his children, Jesus is the father of their sonship. For in him is made the life which is sonship to the Father —the recognition, namely, in fact and life, that the Father has his claim upon his sons and daughters.

We are not and cannot become true sons without our will willing his will, our doing following His making. It was the will of Jesus to be the thing God willed and mean him, that made him the true son of God. He was not the son of God because he could not help it, but because he willed to be in himself the son that he was in the divine idea.



### Music Ministry

We are now into the full swing of Lent. What does that mean for our music in worship? Well, what we do in the United Methodist Church is slightly different than what happens in other Christian religions.

After Christmas, we put away our decorations and the creche is carefully packed until next year. If you are like me, it's a bit of a relief to have a bit of down time after all of the busy activities of the holiday. It is time for a bit of rest. This is what our Lent does for us. It offers us a period of quietness and an opportunity to take some thoughtful time to turn inward.

Many other Christian religions have a practice that the regularly sung Alleluias are removed during Lent and replaced with other responses. It is a way of "burying" them. They are brought back at Easter. They are also directed not to have music that is anything but accompanying the singing. Some churches only allow piano to be played and not the organ nor any other loud instruments.

Ken has spoken in the past about our Sundays being "little Easters". Sundays do not count into the 40 days of Lent so these Sundays are a break from our inward focus. In the Methodist tradition, our music is a reflection of this. While our hymns often reference Lent and its meaning, they are not all in a minor key nor are we required to only play music that is. If you are curious, a very good example is "O Lord, Throughout These Forty Days" found in the UMH #269. It is written in F Major (not minor) and tells us what we can look forward to throughout this season.

May this season be a wonderful time of renewal and looking towards Easter!



### THE SUMC STICKLEY BENCH

Have you noticed the bench in the narthex? It has a story...

At some point in the last year, an old bench found its way to a mess of clutter in the back of the Wesley classroom in the Fellowship Hall, and it sat there in pieces for some time. During the Christmas Tree Walk, Barb Kalm grabbed my arm and led me to the Wesley classroom to show me the bench. In her usual cunning manor and convincing smile, she wondered if I could possibly repair the old bench. She was pretty sure it was from the earliest days of the church and hoped it might be restored and on display somewhere in the church. I am a woodworker and have been all my life, but the last job I want is to repair, and especially refinish, an old piece of furniture. But this was God's work, so how could I say "No". A month or so later I went to the FLC to pick up the bench. Fortunately for me, some UMW women were in the Wesley room sewing and stuffing pillows, and Connie Railsback helped me carry the chair and its broken pieces to my car. I took it home to my workshop and got to work.

First, I made major repairs to a couple of parts on the backrest and refinished them, then reglued the legs and structural pieces on the underside of the bench. But when I turned the bench over to have better access, I noticed a sticker on the underside. Upon examination the first thing I saw was the name "Stickley and Brandt Chair Co, Binghamton, NY." I ran into the house very excitedly, shouting to Betsy, "Holy Cow, it's a Stickley! I'm not qualified to work on a Stickley!" Betsy was not impressed because she had never heard of Stickley. But at this point I had no choice. The pieces were in various stages of repair, so I had to continue, and the finished product is what you see in the narthex.

What about Stickley? There were 5 Stickley brothers, trained in furniture making by their father. Three of them opened the first furniture venture in 1884 called the Stickley Brothers Furniture Co. Charles left almost immediately and formed a company known as Stickley-Brandt Chair Co. in Binghamton NY. This company went out of business in 1919, a victim of WW I and the dying Arts and Crafts Market. Over the years the Stickley brothers formed 9 different companies, and today Stickley furniture can bring at auction thousands of dollars and is in high demand for anyone who dabbles in antique American furniture. There is a wide variation of today's value of a furniture piece depending on which brother built the piece in which factory.

My gut feeling about the bench: I think it was built in in Binghamton NY in approximately 1884, the same time

the Solon Methodist was erected, and I feel that this bench was a fixture in the church when it first opened its doors.

My three-part challenge to you: 1. Locate the three major repairs on the bench. They are all visible from the front. 2. Rub your hand across the seat to feel the shape that Charles formed with his mallet and chisel. 3. Sit on the bench (carefully!) so you can report to your peers and siblings that you sat on a Stickley! You could also

mention that it is 120-130 years old.

### Finance Update

It is a slow process but SUMC members are beginning to establish online accounts at <u>soloniaumc.churchtrac.com</u>. Once you have an account set up, you can edit the details of your church membership and also see, at any time, a report on your giving to the church for the current year.

About 30% of the members who have automated giving have made the necessary switch from Vanco to Stripe, which is associated with our new ChurchTrac giving and accounting program.

All members who have established an online SUMC account can explore signing up for automated giving through Stripe. Just click on the 'Online Giving - click Here' line in the Donate box on the home page of the SUMC website and continue on from there. Our church treasurer, Ivan Hasselbusch, has developed a procedure describing the steps to be taken. 


Thank you to ALL who volunteered their time to prepare and work the soup supper.




#### UNITED METHODIST MEN
