## **Trustee Update**

I wish to send out a big thank-you and ongoing appreciation to the Trustees Committee, church leadership and supportive members of our committee's purpose to maintain and provide capital improvements to the church facilities!

The trustees committee members provide many talents, expertise and forward thinking with their ideas. All the members serve because they believe in this church and care for providing the best service to it's members for today and for the future. The following is a list of completed projects over the past five years:

- -renovation of the Christian education rooms, ceilings, hallways and new tables/chairs
- -renovation of the nursery and event room in the FH basement
- -renovation of the offices of the church admin, Christian ed leader and sec/treasurer
- -renovation of the front entry ramp and narthex
- -renovation of the sanctuary stage/lighting and addition of the audio/video platform
- -installed new camera and sound system in the sanctuary
- -installed high speed internet, new office PC's and phone system
- -repair of the FLC foundation drainage issue
- -replaced the garden shed and its landscaping
- -installed new FH and sanctuary windows
- -renovation of the kitchen island
- -purchased new kitchen stove, new refrigerator for FH
- -installed new fire alarm system in the FLC
- -installed big screen TV in the FH
- -replaced the exterior double doors in the FLC gym
- -replaced 5 HVAC units in the church
- -replaced the parsonage deck and water heater
- -installed heat cables on the church entry roof and gutters for snow and ice
- -removed five dead trees from church and parsonage property
- -replaced church and FH roof after the derecho
- -repaired the sanctuary quilter's window
- -installed radon system in the parsonage
- -install of pickleball courts in the FLC gym



Special thanks goes to those that volunteered to help with the Christian education renovation and removal of the cabinets and desks from the old high school and carrying into the FH basement, teardown activity needed for the start of the renovation projects and the sanctuary stage & A/V platform renovation work along with the camera and sound system oversight. Same for the removal of the dead trees and providing the equipment. Same for the offices renovation and design work.

Special thanks also goes out to all who volunteer their expertise and labor for planting and maintaining church, parsonage and garden plants/flowers and landscaping. Same to all added volunteer help for needed FLC gym floor and church/FH cleaning. Also for those that volunteer their expertise to operate the sanctuary A/V sound equipment.

Finally to Al Hulse for his continued expertise and repair work when needed for lighting, electrical needs, bathrooms, FH chairs, church doors/locks, getting keys made, plumbing church fire extinguishers, church fire alarms and parsonage upkeep needs.

I apologize for any projects I may have missed and again a heartfelt thanks and blessings for all supporting this church! I am leaving the trustees committee after six years of serving and am confident the existing members will continue to do a great job!

## **SHELTER HOUSE IOWA CITY**

The Shelter House of Iowa City posted on their Facebook page that they had an urgent need for bedding supplies.

"It has been a record breaking two months of move-ins for this time of year. Our Rapid Rehousing work continues in earnest as we help folks move from shelter into their own apartments. During these cold months, we bring so many community members out of the cold: in Emergency Shelter, in Emergency Shelter Overflow, in Winter Emergency Shelter, and in the Emergency Shelter lobby during the days. This means that we are in extra need of pillows, blankets, and twin-sized sheets for our Winter Shelter program, and we are in urgent need for beds and mattresses for Rapid Rehousing."

Wesley Class sponsored the purchase of new items of bedding and others have donated slightly used bedding items. This resulted in THREE car loads of items delivered over the past two weeks. So much so that they are stopping deliveries until they can sort and organize what they currently have in their limited storage space!



#### **BRIDGEHAVEN**

United Women in Faith delivered layette sets to Bridgehaven for their new baby gifts. These sets contain a receiving blanket, bib, burp pad, hat and booties. Coleen Pumphrey and her friend continue to make these sets for our delivery to this worthwhile organization.
