My Friends.

As a new year begins and takes shape before us and in us, I thought I would share some John Wesley with you. A reminder that we are diverse in thinking and in attitude. It does not mean we are enemies in some vast tribal world of hate. Let me begin with Wesley's words on salvation:

By salvation I mean, not barely, according to the vulgar notion, deliverance from hell or going to heaven, but a present deliverance from sin; a restoration of the soul to its primitive health, its original purity; a recovery of the divine nature; the renewal of our souls after the image of God... True religion is the loving God with all our heart, and our neighbour as ourselves; and in that love abstaining from all evil and doing all possible good to all (persons). ~John Wesley

As John Wesley was often fond of doing, He referred to scripture. In Deuteronomy 6:4-9 we read part, "Hear O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone." You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. Bind them as a sign on your Lord, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

As we move forward into 2023 let us do so with intentional purpose. That is to be renewed and restored by God for the Hope, Joy, Peace and Love ushered by the birth of Jesus. Despite the desire by some to divide and to throw daggers of hate we must resist! We must rise in compassion and care. Rise in patience and hope. Rise in Grace and Mercy. We are God's children, and we are yet learning what that means.

To be children of God means in part that we have been born into God's family. We become God's children through faith in Jesus Christ, which is our spiritual rebirth. Reborn, not with a physical birth from human passion or plan, but a birth that comes from God" (John 1:12-13). You are very, very special my friends. There are also others who are special as well. You may not see this right away; it can take time. However, take your time and be patient with yourself and with others.

Let me finish with one more quote from John Wesley. A very important one in looking at the current culture around us.

We must act as each is fully persuaded in his (or her) own mind. Hold you fast that which you believe is most acceptable to God, and I will do the same. I believe the episcopal form of Church government to be scriptural and apostolical. If you think the Presbyterian or Independent is better, think so still and act accordingly. I believe infants ought to be baptized, and that this may be done either by dipping or sprinkling. If you are otherwise persuaded, be so still, and follow your own persuasion. It appears to me that forms of prayer are of excellent use, particularly in the great congregation. If you judge extemporary prayer to be of more use, act suitable to your own judgment...If thou love God and all (humanity), I ask no more. "Give me thine hand."

Often, we have more in common with each other than we may have thought!

From the Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC)

December 2022

A few things to discuss with the congregation:

1: <u>Pastor Ken retiring</u>. As previously announced, Pastor Ken is retiring. Church Council and SPRC have been working together to create and forward to District



Superintended Doug Cue a description of who we are in the Solon United Methodist Church and what we are looking for in a new Pastor. Superintendent Cue will review our request and with the help of many others in the Iowa Conference use this information to find a replacement for Pastor Ken that best matches our needs and desires as a church. This search process is ongoing now and we expect to hear additional information in late winter/early spring 2023 regarding the results.

2. <u>Pastor Ken will be taking a six week leave of absence</u> beginning on January 1st for a professional sabbatical and opportunity for spiritual renewal. In the interim, SPRC is arranging coverage for the following items:

Providing a Pastor or credentialed lay leader to provide worship services for six Sundays beginning 1/1/2023

Having an on call pastor available for spiritual needs as well as administration of funeral rites etc... Continuation of the current confirmation class

As a reminder, Pastor Ken will be retiring from the SUMC in June 2023.

2. <u>Joe Massa</u>, Director of Christian Education, has left SUMC. We wish Joe the best of luck and we greatly appreciated his insight into how to address the needs of our Christian Education program at SUMC.

On behalf of the SPRC, we wish you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

We are very excited to see what God has in store for us in 2023.

Based on the format of the traditional service, Lessons and Carols, held each Christmas Eve in the Chapel of King's College in Cambridge, England, it incorporates carol within scriptural lessons. It is a special service that starts in the Garden of Eden, then continues through to the prophet Isaiah foretelling the birth of Christ, and then the peace that Christ will bring to the world. The angel then appears to Mary, then the birth of Jesus, the shepherds' journey, next the wise men following the star, and finally St. John's unfolding of the mystery of Christ's birth. In between each of these is a relevant carol or hymn, or sometimes a medley of two. Everyone has always enjoyed this and I know SUMC will too!

Bells and Chancel Choir will join together on Sunday, January 15 for a combined piece, "Can You Hear the Christmas Bells?". You won't want to miss it!

Staff have been working hard the past month or so to transition from our old church software, Power Church, to our **new software and easy to use APP Church Trac!**

So far we are loving the new software, it is very easy to use, has an APP for the congregation to download and includes website service. They also have great customer service, reports are easy to pull and we can communicate to you all through text and email via the software! Check out the history of Church Trac below!

Our History

From the beginning, ChurchTrac has been all about helping Christian churches, ministries, and leaders. In 2002, ChurchTrac founder Byron Tedder was serving on staff at a local church. But his church had a problem...there were more people coming than they could keep up with! Back then (just like today) church software was either expensive, difficult to use, or both.


So, Byron got to work, creating a simple database for keeping track of members and guests. He continued working on his project and it wasn't long before ChurchTrac was born. Fast forward over 20 years later, Byron (and his Team) are still creating and innovating and serving the local church. Today, ChurchTrac is helping over ten thousand churches keep track of their members and guests...and so much more.

While staff are loving the new program, that doesn't mean that we don't expect hiccups, we are all still learning! Please be patient as we navigate this changeover.

Some really great news is that you can have Church Trac right at your fingertips yourselves! You can check out our website, create a login and have access to your personal information and even your giving information and donate all from your phone. This will allow us to keep more accurate church records and allow you all to have easy access at any time!

You can either view on the website or click on the QR code button on the right of our web address and download the Connect App for super fast, at your fingertips service!





You can click the 'sign in' button in the top right hand corner and then choose

'create an account' and use your email address to proceed. Once you are all approved and logged in your should be able to see what information the church has on file for you AND you'll be able to update or fill in any missing information yourself!

Though loneliness is common, how and why people experience it varies widely. Some people may live a happy and healthy life with minimal social interaction, while others may have contact with family and friends and still feel alone. Many factors, like isolation due to the pandemic, the loss of a loved one, and even the weather can increase feelings of loneliness. Those who live alone, the elderly, and those grieving tend to experience loneliness more than others.
