

Think for a moment about a friend that you have had in your life. How did you meet that person? What was it that drew the two of you together into friendship? How did you treat each other? How did the relationship grow over time? What did you have in common? Did you make any changes in your life because of that friendship? Was your friendship a net benefit in your life, or a detriment? Are you still friends with the person you thought of, or have the two of you drifted apart?

The reason I ask you these questions is so that you won't be thinking abstractly about the idea of friendship when I ask you a few more questions. I don't want you thinking about the idea of friendship generally, or about some kind of perfect ideal that you've never actually experienced, but about a real, tangible friend whom you loved and who loved you.

Now that you are thinking about your experience of real friendship, let me ask you a few more questions. Have you found that your friends helped you to form your understanding of yourself as a person? Were the ideas your friends believed important to you? Did their value system matter to you? When you and your friend disagreed about something, did it make you think deeply? Did you ever change your mind about something because of your relationship with a friend?

The love of a friend is a powerful thing, isn't it? We were designed by God to be social creatures, so being in relationships with others is how we find ourselves. We talk to other people about what we believe, and in friendship, we can trust the other person enough that we can become real and vulnerable with them. When we care about another person, we listen to them differently; their ideas and beliefs, and the things that they think are really important interact with our own values and beliefs. We grow and change because we are willing to be vulnerable and make friends with others. An unfriendly person, someone who is grouchy and drives others away, is unlikely to grow very much; they have lost the most powerful source of stretching and growing: friendship.

Of course, not all growth is equal. Scripture tells us that there are friendships that are life-giving and other friendships that can destroy our very souls. Have a look at the first verse in the book of Psalms and see what it says about the corrupting nature of some friendship. Proverbs 13:20 says that those who walk with the wise will become wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm.

With all of this in mind, think for just a moment about what Jesus offers you in John 15:14: You are my friends if you do what I command you. You are being invited into the powerful relationship of loving friendship with the Messiah himself. If you take him up on that offer, what kind of effect do you think that will have on your life?
