Dear Siblings in Christ,

Grace is undeserved favor. Mercy is kindness we should not receive. Salvation is love stooping down to pull us up when we're at our worst. In this season of resurrection, we both need and celebrate these truths in the promise of eternal life with the Lord.

I learned this lesson recently, again, while visiting someone I've known nearly 18 years. We know each other only tangentially. But, she's a soul sister, one who connects deeply with me because Jesus is at the center of our relationship. She needed, like any of us, to hear of God's pervasive, persistent forgiveness, to hear that Christ works in her despite her best efforts to mess up and make poor choices.

As I prepared to depart, I asked her what I should write about in my newsletter, knowing she'll likely not live to read it. (The horrid "C" word.) She said, reflecting her quick, witty humor, "Tell 'em she was a good egg, a rotten egg, but a good one." We laughed and I understood that she got the message in this tender and final time of her life. And I heard it for the first time, anew.

The Lord works in us to right our wrongs. That doesn't mean we don't have responsibilities or amends to make, but it frees us to do so. God lends us strength to do the hard stuff. In fact, God, in Christ, has done the hardest stuff—saved us from the misery of our sins. This forgiveness business is real, and it allows life to flourish.

My soul sister is dying, but God's love is allowing her to live, not just because she's got a Baptized Child of God Ticket to Heaven, but because God's grace stooped down, and pulled her up out of the darkness of her guilt and worry. Let God pull you up, too. His promise is for real. I'm grateful to have been reminded today. Thanks be to God!

Thanks to Jen and Sue for starting a weekly review/reconciliation of Church-Trac and Church Windows revenue postings. The process worked well and the total balanced at closing. One individual acct correction needed.

New process started in February to book Merchant Service Fees is working as designed.

No movement in resolving Pastor Terry's charges for health insurance. As we discussed at last Finance meeting since we overpaid in January, we did not make a payment in February. We will continue to pay Pastor Susan's premium but will withhold paying anything for Pastor Terry.

ACNB Trust Interest and Dividends were not booked. Sue will book these entries in March.

YTD General Fund Income \$3K ahead of budget; Synod Benevolence Giving on target with budget; YTD General Fund Income vs. Expenses reflects a surplus of \$10K.
