Dear Siblings in Christ,

A most blessed and holy Lent to you! (And at the very last hour of the month, Hallelujah! He Is Risen!)

Our modern, fast-paced society isn't easily distracted by matters of faith. In fact, the world seems to go on just fine, or thinks it does, without the interruption of faith at all. Each of us likely knows a person, or several, for whom God, in any expression of religion, isn't a thing. Their spiritual needs are either not met, or are weakly and falsely met with untruths from other communal endeavors. Our nation's passion, obsession, and financial commitment to entertainment, including music, screens, and sports, ring a bell?

The people that Peter, or those writing in Peter's name, are writing to are not so different. Enveloped in pagan practices, Hellenistic culture, and vestiges of Greco-Roman religions, they're ignorant of and resistant to the teaching of the Way of Christ. Even those who are believers and followers get sucked into the world's ways and struggle. Sound familiar? Peter uses his letters to address this cultural disparity.

The author, just before the above verses reminds Christians that the Lord has provided all that is needed to escape the corruption of the world and live a true, love-filled, free life in Christ and in the community of the Church. Then, he tells them straight in our verses above—it's time to RSVP. You're invited to new life; tell the Lord you're in!

Lent is a lot like RSVPing to God's invitation to be center stage in our lives. Following Christ calls us to be countercultural

in our striving to be good, faithful, enduring, loving, godly... and, perhaps the toughest in our day... tolerant of one another.

Too often today it's easy to dismiss one another, to turn to social media and post something nasty, to avoid clear honest communication in favor of disparaging remarks to the wrong people in the wrong places, to become angry when understanding would be far more Christlike, or to just not care. Peter's letters encourage us to remember that the gifts of God are ours to use to avoid becoming unfaithful, ineffective followers of Jesus, and unfruitful in our own ministry.

Instead, Peter says, return to the Lord and reattach to the truth that you've already been redeemed from the world's sinful nature. Confirm your own faith in Christ so that you don't stumble. Use these weeks as we journey toward Easter to remove distractions that prevent seeing God everywhere, Christ's love active in the world, and the Holy Spirit's work among us.

With focused senses, hearts, and spirits we won't notice the passing of the days, spring will come, the palms will wave, the story of Christ's great sacrifice will be told, and we'll shout, "He Is Risen!" together in joy... guests at the banquet of God's grace at Easter. Don't miss the party!

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

In February's newsletter Pastor Susan invited your questions about Trinity, the bible, Lutheranism, the Christian faith, etc. To the date of this publication, she's received only two, read on...


Drive-thru Holy Communion Distribution will be held Sunday, March 3 at 10:30 a.m. in the rear of the church near the disability parking.

Gazebo Update: The variance we applied for in order to install a gazebo on the side grassy area, was approved. This gazebo is being installed as a memorial to Paula Lerew Wolf, a former member of Trinity who was baptized, confirmed, and married in Trinity. She is Anita Madsen and Dona Lerew's sister, and Deb King's cousin. Her husband, Dudley Wolf, asked to have a memorial to her at Trinity and the idea of a gazebo seemed fitting. Paula was a florist and an amazing gardener so this seems perfect. The idea was presented to the property committee who supported it and began making plans. However, the permit was denied because Trinity's property is 3.9% over the allotted non vegetative property. We filed for a variance and it was accepted! Installation will be some time in the late spring. The project will be totally funded by Dudley Wolf and family. We hope this gazebo will be used in a variety of ways such as outdoor Sunday school, a spot for prayer, a place to enjoy lunch during Colonial Day, shelter for the students at the bus stop, etc.
