Jesus answered, "I saw you under the fig tree before Philip called you." 49Nathanael replied, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" 50 Jesus answered, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these." 51 And he said to him, "Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man." John 1:43-51

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Inviting others to church is incredibly hard. One study I learned of in seminary, so old that I can't remember who published it, said that the average Lutheran in the U.S. invites someone to church every 23.5 years. Inviting others to a relationship with Christ is even more difficult—we Lutherans just don't talk that way!

We may, in fact, live our whole lives without sharing with anyone the importance of our faith and/or faith practices. In these days of heated debate about EVERYTHING in our lives from sports teams to political parties to which kind of potpie is "real," religious talk is especially avoided. Nobody is interested in more conflict.

That's what makes this scripture passage absolutely sing with good news! Jesus has gone to Galilee; he's gathering disciples; two of John the Baptizer's disciples have left John to follow Jesus; Andrew, one of them, has called his brother Peter to join in. The next day Jesus calls on Phillip. And then we come upon the first skeptic in the story—

Nathanael. You can almost hear him snort, "Ha! You've gotta be kidding me. Can anything good come out of..."

East Berlin? Bermudian? Trinity? I mean, come on. Why follow you to one of those places? Small town. Small school district. Little church. That's the way the narrative goes if you follow the arc of Nathanael's dialogue. If we put ourselves into the story and think about the conversations we've maybe had already, don't we hear their doubts ring like his?

Church is boring. There's nothing there for me. I don't get anything out of it. It's too long for the kids. Sunday is our only day as a family. It's too early. Or, a deeper and incredibly realistic reality: the church and/or the people in it have hurt me too badly. Sadly, religion, or at least its institutions, is avoided because of a whole host of valid reasons. Combined with that potential conflict I mentioned, who'd want to invite anyone more than once in a 1/4 century? We're happy with "I don't come," on one side and "I don't ask," on the other.

But, Jesus invites Nathanael despite his reluctance. Jesus sees and knows him outside of his skepticism, doubt, and inclination to keep doing whatever he's been doing instead of this new thing. Jesus sees us in the very same way, under our own fig trees with our own reluctance to get involved. Our faith is not about all our reasons to put it aside, or our fears, or our hurts. Our faith isn't even about church. It's about Jesus and Jesus alone.

I pray every day that you find Christ at Trinity when we gather. And, I pray that your experience of the Lord outside the building is reason for you to say, "Come and see." This season, maybe this whole year, we'll be focusing on how we can invite others to life with Christ. It's not about our membership or congregational traditions. It's about being first known by, and then knowing the Lord. Jesus sees and loves us all—it's an experience that transcends all our preconceived notions. Let us be

surprised by Christ, and invite others to be surprised too!

#### **Storm Damage Repair Update**

On Tuesday, December 19, the new HVAC unit was installed over the Narthex. The roof under that area was inspected by Don Smith Roofing, December 27 and no damage to the roof area was found. Now that the roof area is watertight, we will proceed with the sanding and re-finishing of the warped Narthex hardwood floor scheduled for the week of January 15, and replace any damaged ceiling tile. Total cost of the September storm damage, which was covered by insurance, was just under \$12K. Please bear with us as we complete the remaining repairs. If everything goes as planned, there will be no disruption to worship services while the flooring is under repair. Narthex window areas that were used to gain access to the roof will be repainted during this time as well.



The payroll outsourcing to Paychex is proceeding as scheduled. All 2024 payroll will be handled through Paychex. While not yet booked to the general ledger, the first 2 months of our new investment structure with ACNB Trust Department has resulted in an interest and dividend net gain (after fees) of \$585.
