Dear Siblings in Christ,

Hosanna to the Lord! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! The King of Israel, indeed of the universe, is RISEN!

I'm a huge fan of royal news. My social media feeds are filled with royal scandals and conflicts. I've seen more facial expressions of Prince William than of Terry McCarthy. (LOL) It's my modern-day soap opera and I confess to having an addiction to the [not really] news. It's pure entertainment and I didn't give it up for Lent.

I worry that we just as easily dismiss Palm Sunday as royal news entertainment. We're passionate about the shout of "Hosanna!" as Jesus rides into Jerusalem but our attention quickly turns to the Passion, also only shortly reviewed, and to shouts of "Hallelujah!" at the empty tomb.

I worry because I don't want us to miss the invitation to be subject to this King—the King of the Jews, our King. We're off and running into the Easter season; the ham's been eaten, the baskets shelved, the bunny forgotten, the Hallelujah's shouted and the Easter pieces recited. So, where is our King? And, more importantly, where is our devotion to him?

This Easter season, as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection, let's remember that resurrection means that he's ALIVE NOW, not just then. He's loving, leading, forgiving, healing, and ruling just as the people gathered in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday recognized. Our lives are so much better when we recognize that we're not alone, but subject to a living Lord, a King who embraces us in this world and the next and invites us to share that good news with everyone we meet. That's royal news worth watching! HAPPY EASTER! Love, Pastor Susan




