Prayer and Spiritual Discernment; Community Needs Assessment; Leadership Development; Engagement and Outreach; Worship Experience Enhancement; Small Groups and Discipleship; Technology and Communication; Hospitality and Follow-Up; Continuous Evaluation and Adaptation; Cultivate a Culture of Evangelism.

As a church we are deeply committed to progress, it is missional, it is instructional (Matt 28) - It is our reason for meeting and being. We are not a cosy-club - Church is not a transactional place where we receive, but a place where we ask before Jesus, 'What can I give' — The community here at AP is God's plan A for mission and discipleship.
