
Prophecy, tongues, and knowledge will stop (pass away). (Did you write an X?) Faith and hope are great. They are not as great as love. (Did you put a **check mark** beside them?) **Love** is the greatest thing in the world. That is the reason God wants His love to go through you to other people.

God made you a **working member** of the church when He added you to the church (His body). He gave you **spiritual skills** called **gifts**. The gifts are like learning a new skill. The more you practice, the better you become. As God uses you to love other people, then your skills become better and better. Their **purpose** is to let more of Christ's love go through you to other people. Your "work" for Him is to become a way for Him to love people. That is the reason He gave you skills.

The most important thing to remember about gifts is that they are ways for you to show Christ's love. You should not ignore your gifts (skills). You should not focus on them either. Gifts are important only if you are letting Christ's love show through them.

This is clear in your first memory verse for this week. It is 1 Peter 4:10. *Read it now*. Here it is again from the **New Life Version**. "God has given each of you a gift. Use it to help each other" (1 Peter 4:10, NLV).

Tomorrow and all week we will be learning more about how to use our gifts to help one another.



WEEK 3: CHURCH SERVICE DAY 2: EVERY MEMBER HAS A JOB

Read 1 Corinthians 12:4-7; Ephesians 4:11-16.

A leg that does not work right causes the whole body to be crippled. A gland that does not work right can kill the body. The Bible is clear that EVERY MEMBER OF A BODY OF CHRIST (CHURCH) HAS A JOB!

God added you to the church to become a working member of it. He gave you spiritual skills called gifts when He put you in the church. You can and should begin to use some of these gifts (skills) immediately. You will not begin to use some gifts God has given you until you become mature. Christ will show you when to use more of your gifts as you become obedient to Christ.

There is a difference between **gifts** and **talents**. A **gift** is a spiritual skill that only Christians have. Many people who are not Christians have talents. Example: Sign language signing is a **talent** that can be used for God or for people. It is not a spiritual gift. Faith is a spiritual **gift** (skill). It is used to give God glory.

11 Christ gave gifts to men. He gave to some the gift to be missionaries, some to be preachers, others to be preachers who go from town to town. He gave others the gift to be church leaders and teachers.

12 These gifts help his people work well for Him. And then the church which is the body of Christ will be made strong.

13 All of us are to be as one in the faith and in knowing the Son of God. We are to be full-grown Christians, standing as high and complete as Christ is Himself.

14 Then we will not be children any longer. Children are like boats thrown up and down on big waves. They are blown with the wind. False teaching is like the wind. False teachers try everything possible to make people believe a lie.


15 But we are to hold to the truth with love in our hearts. We are to grow up and be more like Christ. He is the leader of the church.

16 Christ has put each part of the church in its right place. Each part helps other parts. This is what is needed to keep the whole body together. In this way, the whole body grows strong in love.

WEEK 3: CHURCH SERVICE DAY 3: GIFTS

Read Romans 12:1-8; 1 Peter 1:13-16.

God has given you many spiritual gifts. You must prove that you will **obey** Christ before you can use your gifts. Do you let yourself be used by Christ for loving other people? Other gifts will appear as you let Christ love other people through you so that you can continue to love. The way to get these gifts is through **obeying** Christ.

The Lord is wise enough that He does not give you gifts until you are mature to use them. But, there are two gifts that we believe every Christian has. What do you think these gifts are? You read about them in Romans 12:1-8.

It doesn't matter how poor with money you feel or how rich. You can still **give** and **serve** for Christ's benefit. Did you list these two gifts? You have every reason to believe God has given you these two gifts. You can use them now. We know God expects every Christian to give and to serve. We can know He has given us these gifts.

The gift of giving is talked about in Romans 12:8. The gift of service is talked about in Romans 12:7. The gift of giving also is in 2 Corinthians 9:7. This is the second verse you should memorize this week. Read that verse now.


WHAT YOU MUST NOT DO: Be conformed to this world.

You might have written **lusts** or **desires** or **passions**—depending on what Bible you are using. All of these are caused by **ignorance** (not knowing).

But now you know. Christ living in you and controlling you helps you know God's plan. You are learning as a member of the church more about what Christ wants you to become. The same word is used four times in 1 Peter 1:15-16 (KJV). What is that word?

Can you imagine what would happen if a person tried to use God's gifts the wrong way? Now here is another question you can think about. Do you struggle with the idea of being **obedient** to Christ? WEEK 3: CHURCH SERVICE DAY 5: THE GIFT OF GIVING

Read 2 Corinthians 8:1-5; 9:6-15.

You have two spiritual gifts you can use now. Both gifts (skills) are ways you can let Christ's love show through you.

Yesterday you learned about the gift of _____

The gift of **giving**, like the gift of **service**, is part of the way Christ lets His love show through a person. This kind of love helps the **needs of the Body** (church), not just support of special activities.

Don't misunderstand and think that giving is only a gift God gives to rich people. It is a gift to be used by **all** believers.

"Giving" is a Bible word to explain A PERSON'S PLANNING TO ALLOW SOMEONE ELSE TO OWN SOMETHING THAT HE NOW OWNS. Giving is a change of ownership. This happens because of the Holy Spirit's working in us. When you realize Jesus owns everything you have, it is not hard to let something go to meet the needs of His body, the church. You will have problems only when you continue to think something is yours. The way to be successful is to let the Holy Spirit lead you to give what you have. You do this, believing faithfully that God will take care of your needs. God can take care of your future needs if He leads you to give.

Read 2 Corinthians 8:1-5. Do you think Christians in these verses could 'afford' to give a lot? Why or why not?
Did you write words like <i>poor, poverty, trouble</i> ? Members of the church in Macedonia were not rich, but they gave.
There is one verse you should know by memory before you read the next chapter in 2 Corinthians. Can you write 2 Corinthians 9:7 on these lines?
Now read 2 Corinthians 9:6-15. (Be sure to check your
memorization.) What two verses in verses 6-10 talk strongly about God's taking care of your giving? Verse Verse
Verses 8 and 10 give the answer. What is the reason in verse 11

Your giving is possible because God gives to you. Many people will thank God because of your giving. Second Corinthians 9:13 says that other people will see the giving and will know you are really Christians. Who will get the biggest blessing from your

for God giving to you?

Many people will give glory to God because Christians give to help one another. What commitment (promise) does Christ want you to make as you use this gift of giving? (Remember: He is more interested in your giving to obey Him than in how much you give.)

You become mature in your special gifts when you let Christ use them. You will soon learn that there are other spiritual gifts in your life. God gives them so that your service might increase in showing His love to other people.

You had a hand that could do nothing when you were born. You later learned how to hold things. Later again your hand became more mature and learned to write. Then your mind learned to control your hand to work together to write a letter or in a book. Your hands are **now skilled tools**. They are able to do many things your mind tells them to do.

You become mature through some activities as a member in the body of Christ (church). You find more things ready for you to do after you are matured. Christ will show you other gifts (skills) that you have as you learn to use the gifts of **giving** and **serving**. He will show you what He has given you to increase His love showing and working through you to other people.

All of these things depend on one thing—YOUR OBEDIENCE TO CHRIST! The way to continue growing as you mature is to continue to obey Him. Serve and give. Use your spiritual gifts and skills. It will become clear that Christ is the person who gives you the abilities. He is the one who lives in you and loves through

you. The other things depend on God's plan for you.

Just use for now what you have. Trust the Master (Christ) for the other things. This is a brief study about these things. You will want to learn in the months and the years in the future much more about the spiritual gifts.*

What you need to do now is to focus on the next part of your SURVIVAL KIT. **Two natures** (personalities) live in you. Learn about them now. They will be with you for the rest of your life.
