DISCIPLESHIP APPOINTMENT #10 STEWARDSHIP



The Dictionary defines "steward" as a "manager or superintendent of another's resources." We are stewards of <u>all</u> that God possesses, and His possessions include our money, our talents, our minds, our bodies, and even our time. God requires that we be found faithful in our stewardship of these resources (cf. 1 Cor. 4:2).

God owns everything and is the creator and sustainer of the universe. Read 1 Chronicles 29:11 and Colossians 1:15-18.

A Christian who exercises stewardship is one who realizes that as Christians "we live, and move, and have our being" (Acts 17:28) in Christ. He or she recognizes God as their preeminent master, and lives for Him (Matthew 25:14-30; Romans 12-1). The whole of the Christian's life - personality, time, talent, training, material substance, everything - is dedicated to Christ and will have to be accounted for before God. (Romans 14:12).

Our use of out time, talent, training and treasure, clearly shows our spiritual commitment because we invest in what our heart values most.

God has made each Christian a steward and, He has given us abilities, talents and training that are unique for each of us to use in building the kingdom of God. God has a special place for every Christian to make a difference in our world. To begin to experience both the joy and the responsibilities of our stewardship we need to understand:

I. THE OWNERSHIP OF GOD OUR FATHER AND OUR RESPONSIBILITY



2. God's ownership is eternal and unchanging. He never has given up this right - and never will. For whom was the world created? (Colossians 1:15-18)

When we recognize that God owns everything, including us and all that we have, we can begin the adventure of living under His Lordship. The whole of our life - our personality, influence, material substance, everything - is His, even our successes.

failing to recognize God's ownership?	

God does own us — every bit of our time, talents, training and treasure. Scripture tells us that Christ dies for us, "that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again." (2 Corinthians 5:15, NIV) To not acknowledge and act upon God's total ownership of everything we are, have or hope to be is to rob ourselves of His blessing and make ourselves unfit for His service and use. (2 Timothy 2:19).

4. Many people attempt to compromise and give God less than full allegiance. How does God regard that practice in Matthew 12:30? (cf. Job 9:1-5)
5. How did Jesus describe His attitude toward those who will stand neither for nor against Him in Revelation, 3: 15-20?
6. What then is to be our response to God? (Romans 12:1-2)
7. What logical choice did Elijah present to the people? (1 Kings 18:21)
If Elijah's logic is true, we must take one of two positions. If we determine Jesus Christ is Lord and God, we must serve Him loyally. If He is not, Christianity is obviously a hoax, and we should dissuade men from being Christians. But it is one or the other! We must stand either with Christ or against Him, but never try to stand in between with a divided heart. A LIFE APPLICATION
What do you think God will do with your life if your surrender it all to Him?
2. Are you conscious of something in your life which you have not surrendered to the control of your heavenly Father? [yes/no] What is it and how will you now deal with it?
3. How much of your life are you willing for God to control (Remember, He is all wise and loves you with a perfect love)?

4. How is it that some may accomplish more than others in the same amount of time?
5. What changes will you make in the way you use your time?
II. THE OWNERSHIP OF GOD THE FATHER AND OUR RESPONSE
1. Read 1 Timothy 6:6-10. What should be combined with godly character?
2. Define contentment
3. What is the temptation that we are commanded to avoid?
4. Discuss how the quest for financial gain can cause people to "pierce themselves wit many griefs." (1 Timothy 6:10 NIV).
